Employee Spotlight: Meet Joei Perry

From Pittsburgh to Memphis to Germany and back, Joei Perry has traveled many roads. A graduate of Harvard College, she has worked as a human resources professional, an opera singer and now as our Assistant Director of Faculty Support Services. Following you'll find a glimpse of her story.

Tell me a bit about your background and what brought you to the Boston area.

I was raised outside of Memphis, TN, but was born in Pittsburgh, PA. My dad was in the military so we moved to Germany when I was a few months old and lived there until I was 5. We then moved back to the States, specifically to Louisiana, where we lived for two years before moving to Tennessee. There I spent most of my life before coming to Cambridge for school.

What were some of the highlights of your undergraduate experience?

I double majored in Psychology and pre-med, which was great. But I also took a year off to work for the Clinton campaign and for the mayor of my town. Then I came back to Harvard, where I met my husband, and we graduated together!

Did you stay around Boston after graduation?

We did. My husband and I each got progressively better jobs and decided to stay here. I was in Human Resources at the time, but I stopped working in HR because I was getting into more of the HRIS aspect of it and I missed my interactions with people. I think I'm more of a people person. I really thrive on human interaction. So I stopped working and started applying to graduate schools, and in 2002 I started a master's program in opera performance at Longy School of Music, I finished in '04 and have been doing professional singing since then.

You gave a phenomenal performance with Brad Conner at the Dean's Award for Excellence in June. What was that experience like for you?

That experience was really nerve wracking because you're singing for people that you know and you're going to see them every single day! And it's like, 'you better be good!' I have good friends at the Law School who are also musicians and they know that I sing but they'd never heard me doing so. It was very gratifying, though, because at differ-

ent points in my life I've thought about whether singing was really for me, and then something happens that completely affirms that you should be doing it, and that was one of those moments. It really meant a lot to me to be asked to sing at this event.

Tell me about your role at the Law School.

I'm the Assistant Director of Faculty Support Services, and in a basic sense I feel like faculty support is really just exactly what the title suggests, in that we're here to support the faculty, and whether that means that we support them in the sense that we find them the right type of assistant or by helping assistants to make sure they can provide the best assistance possible to the faculty. So in that sense we're not just a resource to the faculty but also for the assistants. Faculty Support Services essentially is a team that serves as a support mechanism for both faculty and faculty assistants. *Story continues on page 7.*

The Girl with the Dragon Tattoo by **Stieg Larsson** is the first novel in a captivating trilogy and I could not put it down! The writing of the mystery thriller was very descriptive and left me wanting more. This is a must read and I look forward to reading *The Girl Who Played with Fire* and *The Girl Who Kicked the Hornet's Nest*.

This summer I read *Born to Run: A Hidden Tribe, Superathletes, and the Greatest Race the World Has Never Seen* by **Christopher McDougall**. It is a story about the Tarahumara Indians of Mexico's Copper Canyon who can run incredibly long distances without getting tired or injured. It also gets into the culture of a group of American ultrarunners, some of whom go to Mexico to run against these indigenous people. I am definitely not a runner, but it was a fascinating book.

Ever since she was heralded in the New Yorker's recent 20 under 40 issue, I've been looking out for **Tea Obrecht's debut novel, *The Tiger's Wife***. This amazing novel combines stories of the war in the Balkans with a variety of captivating narratives. Obrecht has the lyricism of F. Scott Fitzgerald and I cannot recommend it more highly! It is easily one of the best books I've read in the past 5 years.

What's your favorite aspect of the job?



I think it's anything that I have to do where I can interact with the larger HLS community. So for example, I'm working with some folks in HR to come up with a mission statement for a minority affinity group we're in the process of putting together. I get to work with a number of folks outside of my department in talking about the FTEs and fleshing out what's going on in our department in terms of assignments. It's always good to have input from outside of our unit because it gives me a broader view of what the goal of the Law School is. I'm also on the Event Planning focus group. I was on the Faculty Support Focus group for the employee survey, and I'm also on the Restaurant Associates focus group. So I like being in these groups where I'm doing something to contribute to the greater good of the whole Law School.

That's terrific, Joeli. You stay busy! As a professional opera singer, I imagine you're as busy outside of the office as well!

I am! Another one of my projects is that I've been doing outreach with Opera Boston for several years, and we decided to collaborate with an organization called Missing Links, because they provide arts education for underprivileged, inner city kids. We provide interactive workshops for middle school students, and for high schoolers it's more of guidance in their music careers. We have summer and spring programs where they get to do a stage show that has opera selections in it. And at the college level we try to guide the kids that have been in the program, or those who would like to join at that time, into finding places they can go for musical education, if that is indeed what they want; and then finding funding for them or raising funds within the organization to give them money for books or for music, or to help them travel to auditions when they're ending their college education, because that's the time when you go out and, as a musician, you pay for all of those expenses out of pocket, to travel there and to stay at a hotel, etc. So it can be really difficult for someone who has no financial support and can't hope for that from their families. I think it's so important to make classical music accessible to kids in the inner city, and I'm glad we have organizations like these to fill that need.

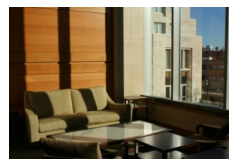
