Some important points follow:

- Students writing an LL.M. Long Paper who wish to devote the winter term to furthering their work on that paper, in Cambridge, instead of taking a course must apply for the Winter Term Writing Program through the Graduate Program, after having registered for the LL.M. Long Paper. Applications will be available by mid-October.
- A student who submits the same or substantially the same work for more than one course or seminar without prior permission will be subject to disciplinary action. Students who believe this category applies to them should consult with the Graduate Program and prepare a Multiple Use of Written Work log, which must be approved and signed by the supervisors of all applicable work. This rule applies to all academic work whether at HLS or elsewhere.
- A student who has more than one project of extra-credit writing in progress at HLS should file a Written Work Log, signed by the HLS faculty supervisor(s) of the written work. A completed log form should be submitted with the registration to the Graduate Program for the second of two projects and again with the registration for any subsequent project.
- In no event will credit be granted for a paper the work for which has been compensated, in whole or in part.
