

SEVEN-YEAR INDEPENDENCE CERTIFICATION FORM FROM BOTH BIOLOGICAL PARENTS

Members of the J.D. Class of 2010 may appeal to be considered financially independent from parents by the seven-year standard. If you can answer “YES” to question 1 and “NO” to ALL of the remaining questions, and provide the required documentation, you will be considered financially independent from your parents for the purpose of determining eligibility for HLS need-based aid. If you are granted independence from your parents, no parental contribution will be imputed or expected for this academic year, nor will you be required to submit your parents’ financial information when applying for need-based aid in future years.

Required Documentation: To complete the certification process, Harvard Law School requires **signed photocopies of the first two pages** of your biological parents' Federal Income Tax Returns from **ALL** of the following tax years: **2004, 2005, 2006, 2007, and 2008**.

- If your parents were not required to file taxes in one or more of these years, please ask them to submit a signed written statement to that effect in place of the tax form(s).
- If your parents cannot locate a copy of any of their past tax filings, they can use IRS Form 4506 (<http://www.irs.gov/pub/irs-pdf/f4506.pdf>) to request that a photocopy be sent to them. Be sure to include a copy of any request made to the IRS with this form when submitting it to our office.
- We must have **signed photocopies of the first two pages** of the actual returns filed with the IRS. *IRS transcripts of tax records are not acceptable.*
- Before submitting any tax documentation to Student Financial Services, be sure to write your name and social security number on all pages so that it can be matched up with your records.
- If you do not know the whereabouts of one or both of the parents from whom you are seeking independence and/or you are not able to obtain their tax forms or signatures, please attach a statement to this form explaining in detail the circumstances of your situation. **You, the student, should still include your notarized signature on the Independence Form.** The Financial Aid Appeals Committee will review your request and respond accordingly.
