We welcome applications from HLS students with prose fiction, memoir and biography projects, who wish to join a weekly group in the Spring Semester, to discuss their works in progress.

The group is for J.D. and graduate students in the Law School. Meetings will take place on Wednesdays, 3-4:30pm through the Spring Semester. Regular attendance will be important. Members of the group will submit work regularly for class discussion. Rose Moss will assign some passages or short stories for participants to read. No direct academic credit is provided for membership in the group, but Janet Halley will offer to provide a 1-credit independent-study supervision to students in the course, and has a list of other faculty also willing to consider such arrangements.
