“Drink ‘Em Dry: Solidarity for Success” is a candid and progressive view of union solidarity which developed despite tremendous odds, in a Maritime community in eastern Canada.

When Moosehead Breweries pushed away from the negotiating table and locked out the 175 members of Local 362, the union was stunned – not only by the lockout but by the seeming rejection of their company loyalty which had sustained them, the company and the community for 144 years.
